everyone for the outpouring of support following his small stroke during the holidays. He also declared LMH is a great facility

Alan was a firefighter at Fort Myer in Arlington, Va., where the chiefs of staff live, on Sept. 11, 2001. He was working on a 3-man crew at the Pentagon heliport, where President Bush had flown out on the day before and was due back later that day. After hearing about the first plane strike at the World Trade Center, they began watching television and saw the second plane hit. His superior called to make sure they knew the country was under attack.

They walked outside not long before they heard the next plane approaching a split second before it slammed into the Pentagon. He said they had about a half-second to react as the plane hit very near their location. Alan said he did not see his life pass in front of him. He just realized they were under attack and moved into action. He said the impact was not loud as it was drowned out by the engine noise.

Alan then described how he dove under van but had to retreat due to the heat and run back through debris. Eventually he realized his fire truck has been hit in the back, possibly by a wing. He described the radio call he made to others. Eventually, he and others were able to rescue about a dozen people out of a window. Overall, 185 people, including an unborn baby died.

Rotarians gave him a standing ovation at the conclusion of his speech.
