**Sergeant-At-Arms: Bill Cost** fined a number of people today, including **Gary Baker**; **Nancy Neely**, and husband **Jack**; **Herb Odle** and **Glenn Abel**; **Bob McGaughy**.

**Our Program:** Rotarian **Chris Meyer** introduced speaker Andy Joseph from APEKS Supercritical. Andy is president a Johnstown-based manufacturer of a fully automated subcritical and supercritical carbon dioxide (CO2) botanical oil extraction systems.

APEKS has been designing and manufacturing botanical oil extraction equipment since 2001 and introduced patented "Valve less Expansion" technology in 2012. APEKS has more than 300 CO2 extraction systems installed in 20 states across the US and internationally. Andy is a Navy veteran of six years and then earned his degree in Welding Engineering from the Ohio State University.

Apeks employees 21 people. The CO2 method of oil extraction is the most efficient; it's a closed loop system and is the cleanest and safest method. Andy talked very knowledgeably out his business. In 2009, a medical marijuana company approached Andy on developing a machine for the extraction of THC from marijuana plants; he researched it and agreed to do it.

One machine can process 10 pounds of plant material in 24 hours and receive a 10 percent yield equal to 450 grams of oil extracted. At wholesale cost, it yield \$15 a gram. His machines average \$6,750 per day. His buyers of the product must pay in cash due to federal laws. This is a big problem for him and he found using Wells Fargo to handle and store the money. They can be used as a bank and have money wired in and out. (During his learning curve, he found that a Twinkie box would comfortably fit \$10,000 in one hundred dollar bills).

He was thankful that issue #3 on the last election did not pass. It would have created a monopoly that would not have been good for the industry as a whole, giving just a hand full of people a leg up on the control of marijuana. He felt the federal government would have probably stepped in since it is still federally illegal giving a black eye to Ohio and the industry.

Andy sees this growth bubble of this industry lasting only another 3 to 5 years and will go back to other botanical oil extraction, such as plants for perfumes. He says this is a much bigger industry with a need for his equipment. Andy cited another big problem with the medical marijuana industry is that there are no official clinical studies being done; he sees a strong need for research programs. This would be a big step forward in the cause and need for the product.
