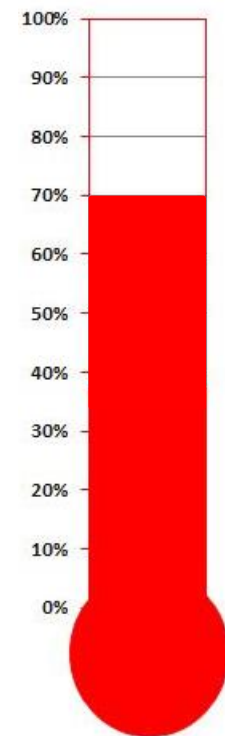

Three-minute speech by Victoria Reed: She was born in Dayton and treasures her childhood and all experiences she's had in her 51 years. She was commissioned by the Air Force in 1986 and was in the Air force for 28 years. Vicky has two sons and is proud of her children, husband and happy each day. Currently, Vicky is employed by CTEC as the school to work coordinator. Welcome Vicky!

Program: Tom Cummiskey introduced Dr. Rustin Moore, Dean of OSU College of Veterinary Medicine. Dr. Moore thanked Ron Fuller for his work and friendship. Dr. Moore began by showing a short video on what he does each day and shared information about the OSU College of Veterinary Medicine. OSU is the only university with seven health science colleges on one campus which includes the largest clinical trial offices. Veterinarians are on the front line to prevent diseases beginning with animals then moving to humans. Dr. Moore shared they must reinvent how medicine is taught and practiced and

OSU is the second largest vet college in the US. There are only 30 veterinary colleges in the United States. OSU is ranked 5th by US News and World Report.

Dr. Moore shared it is a very competitive process to gain entrance into the college. Half of the candidates are from Ohio and half are from out of state. Dr. Moore shared the makeup, which is 86% women and 14% underrepresented minorities which includes 130 faculty and 400 staff in the medical center.

The first feline leukemia vaccine was created at OSU, which also pioneered the total hip replacement in dogs 40 years ago. Dogs normally have this procedure done when young and are able to recover quickly and lead a normal, productive life.

Vets have played a prominent role in many diagnoses. 35,000 cases are seen each year on main campus. There are 45 known specialties at OSU to work closely with private practice physicians. Clinical trials are offered for a variety of cases. Dr. Moore shared cancer in dogs behaves very much like human cancers in which there is a collaboration with the Comprehensive Cancer Center.

OSU is the first college to work with shelters-vet students spay and neuters. OSU is a land grant university with four goals: Teach, serve, research and outreach which is why there is a focus to be engaged civically to give back. Dr. Moore shared OSU has a bright future with many challenges with bold goals to achieve. Most important mission is to educate future veterinarians. To learn more you can visit vet.osu.edu. Dr. Moore said he would be honored to host a meeting and give a behind the scenes tour of the hospital.

Jack reminded us of the free enterprise academy meeting and new member orientation meetings after our meeting today and to be sure to see Deb Tegtmeyer to sign up for bell ringing.
