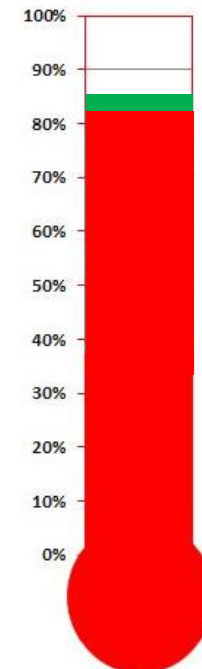

**Program: Past President Tom Mareclain** introduced the speaker, Kay Spergel, Director of the Mental Health and Recovery Board. She started by

thanking everyone as well as all of Licking County for voting 63% in favor of their levy in November and demonstrating continued faith in the organization.

Her agency is a county government entity responsible for the planning, monitoring and funding of the public behavioral healthcare system. They are responsible for Licking and Knox County. They have an 18-member board and have a ten year renewal levy cycle and an \$8.2 million annual budget. They purchase services or programs from providers in the community.

Their program beliefs are that behavioral health is essential to a good life, prevention works, treatment is effective and people recover. To quote Penny Sitrler, "There is no health without Mental Health!"

Signs of at risk behavioral health include: Suicidal Thinking; Depression and/or Anxiety; Post Traumatic Stress; Substance Abuse; Underage drinking or inappropriate drinking in adults

As in any kind of health, early detection and screening are critical. The biggest barrier to getting help is the stigma surrounding mental health.

The criteria for determining allocation of dollars is risk, medical necessity, priority populations, statutory requirements, best industry standards and assessment of need.

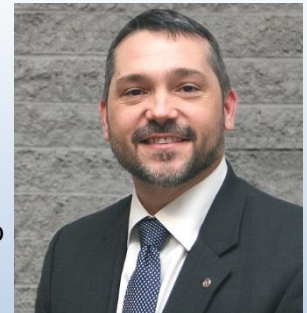
