The prayer and Pledge of Allegiance was led by **Tim Fitterer**.

Student guests from CTEC were: Thom Gamertsfelder, with host **Tim Fitterer**; Ken Kraemer from Licking Heights; Amy Anderson from Northridge with students Aili Barbee and Brenton Ickes, who had their bios read by **Nancy Neely**. As usual the students were amazing with all their academic and extracurricular achievements. Guests of Rotarians were Brendan Underwood and Deb Dingus, guests of **Rob Klinger**; Nora Noble, guest of **Marcia Downes**; Chris Keck, guest of **Rob Montagnese**, Bill Hayes, guest of **Jon Spahr**; Larry Palur, guest of **Denny Hesselgesser** and Sally Heckman, guest of **Paul Thompson**. Jim Flaherty, past District Governor from the Westerville Sunrise club, also was our guest.

Three About Me: Our three about me was a Rotarian who escorted Miss Universe and danced with Zsa Zsa Gabor. They must have liked loud clothes. **Jerry Krebs** was the guy.

Sergeant-At-Arms: **Pat Jeffries** levied fines, some undeserved, on **Chuck Moore**, **Rob Montagnese**, **Debbie Young**, **Veronica Link**, **Doug Ute**, and fashionably dressed **Jim Withers** and **Jerry Nethers**.

Program: **Rob Montagnese** was introduced as our program by his friend Pat Jeffries. Rob's bio is as long as War and Peace. Highlights are that he has been CEO of Licking Memorial Health Systems for ten years and has received almost all professional awards in his field. He is involved either currently or in the past with The Works, Salvation Army, Newark Campus Development Fund, COTC, Big Brothers/Big Sisters and is a youth sports coach.

Rob's talk focused on Camps and Reunions held by LMH. Camp Feelin' Fine is for kids with asthma, Camp A1c for kids with diabetes, Camp Courageous for those affected by cancer and Camp Med for high school seniors interested in healthcare careers. They also hold a picnic for cancer survivors of all ages, regardless of whether they received their treatment at LMH or elsewhere. Reunions are held for previous patients in their rehab program and for parents of preemies born at LMH.

Rob told us of new initiatives at LMH including the Urgent Care building at the northeast corner of 4th and Locust. Jerry McClain donated the land. Expected opening date is early in 2017. The new building on West Main Street will house the Center for Sight and orthopedic docs. LMH is introducing several new high tech machines to make it easier for patients to have their vital signs read and for greater comfort.

In the Q & A session we learned that LMH now has a program that allows patients to order any kind of meal at almost any time of day or night. The urgent care facilities in Granville and Pataskala have reduced the number of Emergency Room visits a little. Finally Rob recommended the former Newark Medical Center facility for anyone needing blood work.
