Chad Shumaker was born and raised in Newark. Chad is president and owner of CS Construction Group, Ltd., where he oversees the daily operations, along with estimating commercial projects. Chad and his wife, Shanna, also are Herbalife Distributors and own New Life Nutrition in New Albany.
