Three-Minute Speech was given by new Rotarian **Megan Evans**. She went 3 minutes and 19 seconds.

Program: Chris Meyer introduced Carlos Ogden with Mill Street Distillery in Utica.

Mr. Ogden gave an interesting talk about how Mill Street Distillery got started and what process they use to make moonshine, bourbon and grappa. They began being able to sell their moonshine product on July 11, 2013, and introduced their bourbon on August 15, 2015. Their products are in 150 state stores and in many local bars. They hope to be selling an apple brandy sometime in the future. They use 100 percent local corn mash in their products as well as water from the village of Utica. They are closed on Sunday's and Wednesday's. Normal hours are 11 a.m. to 5 p.m. but stay open until 6 p.m. on Friday and Saturday.

This week's speaker: Sara Andrews

Sara Andrews serves as the Director of the Ohio Criminal Sentencing Commission. In 1990, the General Assembly created the Ohio Criminal Sentencing Commission by statute. The Commission is chaired by the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of Ohio. The Commission is responsible for conducting a review of Ohio's sentencing statutes and sentencing patterns, and making recommendations regarding necessary statutory changes. The Commission consists of 31 members, 10 of whom are judges appointed by the Chief Justice.

Before her appointment as the Director of the Ohio Criminal Sentencing Commission, Sara was a more than twenty year veteran with the Department of Rehabilitation and Correction, holding a number of leadership positions, most recently as the Deputy Director of the Division of Parole and Community Services (DPCS) and Chief of the Adult Parole Authority (APA). In that role, she managed the Ohio Parole Board, the Office of Victim Services, the Bureau of Research, Office of Offender Reentry and Religious Services, Jail inspection and oversight, community supervision, fugitive and interstate compact operations, and DRC funded community corrections throughout the State of Ohio. She was also the Ohio Commissioner and national Chair of the Interstate Compact for Adult Offender Supervision and continues to serve in that capacity.

Sara's academic background includes a B.A. from the University of Northern Colorado and M.S. degree from the University of Dayton. She is a member of Ohio Justice Alliance for Community Corrections, the American Probation and Parole Association, and other boards.
