Our Program: Dave Mangas of C-TEC spoke about RAMTEC (Robotics Advance Manufacturing Technologies). RAMTEC's mission is to promote workforce development by offering leading edge educational programs that provide all learners academic and technical skills needed for career opportunities and continuous learning.

The training starts in the middle school where there are currently four county wide programs. In the secondary education there are nineteen career technical programs available. In the adult education there are sixteen accredited training programs. Dave said that engineers from THK, a local manufacturing company, actually came into the school to help students train with Robotic technology machines.

C-TEC also has worked with the Arial Corp. in Mt Vernon; and the Beauty Park in New Albany with both electrical and automation fields.
