Doug Ute as he began his presentation: Adding Branches to the Tree of Education. Doug began by introducing our NCS staff in attendance: Ray Kress, Gemma Zimmerman, Seth Roy, Mindy Vaughn, Director of Student Services, Maura Horgan, Director of Curriculum and Staff Development, Barb Quackenbush, Director of Certificated Personnel Board Members: Warren Weber and Board President Tom Blin. Doug thanked the current school board members as well as Pat Jeffries, Sarah Wallace and Dr. Hall as former board members.

Doug began by sharing 4 students from Newark High School who have been appointed to military academies in recent years. Doug thanked The Works for their support of Newark City Schools and shared our band and orchestra students earned "ones" at the Ohio Music Education Association State Level competition.

Doug shared the improvement with graduation rate and factors that lead to graduation and shared District finances are in the black until 2020.

Doug highlighted:

- The White Field renovations and the beauty of the renovation sharing that it is a "bill board" for Newark.
- Expanded opportunities for students through STEM and Robotics.
- New gifted student opportunities as well as the addition of 3 new Advanced Placement classes at Newark High School.
- 190 students are attending a STEM camp free of charge.

Doug reported nine buildings are above 50% free and reduced lunch as well as the high student mobility rate. Doug shared a variety of stories pertaining to the challenges of our students and what they go through daily.

Doug thanked the partnerships we have with many Rotarians as local leaders and supporters of Newark City Schools.

There were great questions from the Rotarians pertaining to the football program and facilities, staffing, homeless students and students who graduate and attend post secondary school.
