Pat then told a really bad joke to even less sporadic applause than normal.

Program: Board member **Rick Platt** introduced Jeff Garshon from Chromocare in Heath. The company, which has roots in Canada, recently expanded to Heath and is breaking new ground with its DNA test to allow for more precise use of prescription medication.

Jeff began by asking the crowd how many people use prescriptions and whether they always work. Their focus is on genetic technology based on DNA that was not available a few years ago. They can aid a physician in prescribing a medicine for you.

Prescriptions don't always work. Only 50 percent of prescriptions work as hoped on every patient. Some are tougher than others to find correct dosing. In the worst cases, people can die from drug reactions. Every human body is different and that dictates how you respond to a drug. He cited Warafin as a drug that's particularly hard to administer.

Adverse drug reactions are the fourth leading cause of death in the US. One in five adverse events in a hospital are related to medication.

The field is called pharmacogenetics, which is the study of the relationship between genetic mutations and drug response. It evaluates the therapeutic capabilities and potential for adverse reactions in every individual.

Two studies have found a significant number of people who would have experienced mild to serious complications with at least one drug they were being considered due to their genotype. Getting medications correct can save substantial money.

The company's Genetic Assisted Prescribing (GAP) test is a simple swab test in your cheek that costs hundreds of dollars. You can get results in 3-5 days. The test covers 10 genes and more than 300 medications, including the most popular used today. The GAP test produces a report that's very easy to use.

Jeff is very proud of the new facility in Heath and said they chose our community because of the many good things happening at the local Port Authority. The availability of a clean room was key.

In response to a question, Jeff said some insurance companies are not covering the test quite yet because it's so new.
