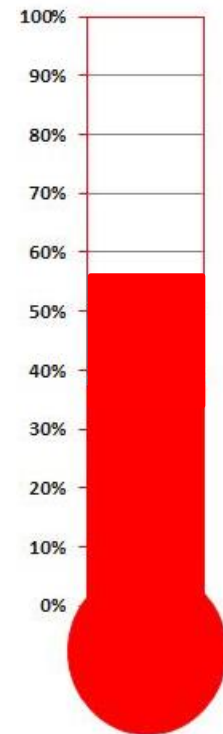

This week's meeting

Eduardo, who was our exchange student from Brazil in 2008-09, spoke to the club and congratulated us on our improving English since his last visit. Program: Rotarian **Ron Fuller** introduced Jerry Knappenberger who spoke about his career and views on the Ohio horse industry.

Harness racing tracks back many years as people first wanted to have the fastest horse and buggy on roads. Actual racing began in Ohio during county fairs of the 1840s. About 65 of Ohio's 95 fairs still have harness racing and there are seven commercial racing tracks. Scioto Downs is one of four who offer harness racing.

Standardbred horses are the breed best known for harness racing. Jerry described how extensive Ohio's industry was and how it became threatened. Other states got expanded gaming well before Ohio, which put our racing industry at risk from 1994 until a few years ago. We nearly lost all of our tracks until video slots were added.

Gaming taxes earned at tracks go to the state for education. The four stand-alone casino taxes go to local governments. Jerry said we've been fortunate to revitalize our industry.

Since gaming came to Scioto Downs in June 2012, the prize money for harness racing has grown from a few thousand dollars to as high as \$25,000 for routine races. A special night of races for Ohio horses will see a pot of \$2 million in September.

Horse racing used to be as big of an industry in Ohio as Honda. We're now back at No. 1 in the nation for producing Standardbreds.

"Ohio is truly the heart of harness racing. Our industry is back on top in the nation. "

He also spoke about how wagering online was threatening the industry, although the problem with rebates has been solved.
