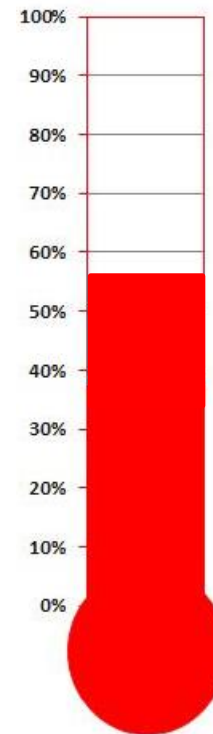

Program: **Jennifer Roberts** introduced Jeremy King, a fellow Denison University graduate who now works there as sustainability coordinator. He also is a key player in the Licking County Solar Cooperative and he spoke to us on solar power.

He focused on debunking myths about solar power, noting Ohio has plenty of sunlight to make it work. Germany gets less sunlight but leads the world in solar production. But he also stressed conservation and efficient use of power are the best things any of us can do. That's how we can reduce our electric bills and our carbon footprint.

For solar power, a photovoltaic cell converts sunlight into a direct electric current, which is converted to an alternating current. Only 127 square miles of land is needed to power the world through solar. And it can be done on buildings, not just open land.

The cost of solar panels is falling dramatically and it's a tried and true technology. And the technology is only getting better.

Solar also can be aesthetically pleasing. He showed pictures of his house with solar panels on the roof, Conesville power plant and fracking. He also showed new solar shingles which may be available here in five or more years.

Jeremy also shared a new device from Tesla, called Powerwall. It's a home battery that charges using electricity generated from solar panels, or when utility rates are low, and powers your home in the evening. It also fortifies your home against power outages. The cost will be \$3,000 but Jeremy describes it as a game changer.

Solar is renewable, silent, has no emissions, is easy to maintain and very cost effective, Jeremy said. He shared how he's saving nearly \$400 a year and benefit from various tax incentives at his house. His panels will break even in eight years.

He wrapped up by describing the many solar efforts across Licking County, including various solar arrays and plans to add panels to the Yes Clubhouse.

This week's speakers: Stephanie Johnson, Batelle

Dr. Johnson is a renowned pastry chef, travel blogger, and long distance runner. Well, maybe in her dreams. Really, she thinks that all kids deserve a great education and has spent her entire career in education hoping to make that a reality. Currently, she is a Relationship Manager with Battelle where she supports, promotes, and connects the state network of STEM hubs, schools, and training centers as well as provides connectivity to Battelle's multi-state networks. She oversees the development and dissemination of effective STEM practices through the Ohio STEM Learning Network including the development of a successful training program for STEM leaders.

She earned a Bachelor's degree in family relations and human development at The Ohio State University while she worked for Columbus City Schools and the original COSI. She was selected to join Teach for America where she taught elementary school in the Rio Grande Valley in Texas for two years. She then earned a Master's in Public Health and a Doctorate in Education from UCLA. While in Los Angeles, her work focused on school-based nutrition and physical activity programs. Finally, Dr. Johnson is married with a spunky and sweet 2 year old which means her old hobbies of reading, cooking, and traveling have been moved to the back burner for now.
