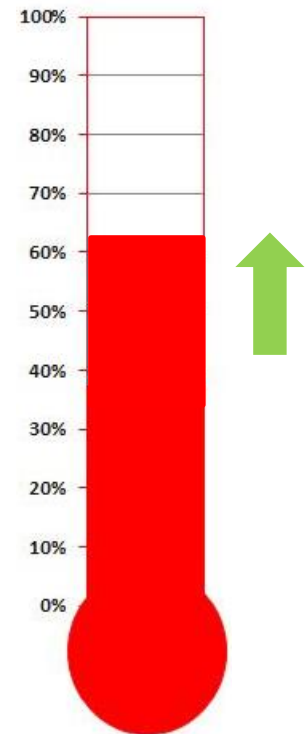

## **This week's speaker:**

### **Adam Rhodes, Homestead Beer Co.**

Adam Rhodes is the co-owner of Homestead Beer Company with its brewery located on the grounds of the "old Air Force Base" in Heath. Adam and his business partner, Kevin Atkinson, are two guys who got the beer bug with a home brew kit from Adam's wife a few years back. The pair took an entrepreneurial leap of faith that saw them abandon their day jobs. Adam traded 1's and 0's as a software engineer to be a brewmaster.



Homestead Beer Company has made a name for itself graduating from two kettles in 2012 to eight now. Their tasting room is a beer lover's must-stop and is now open six days a week with a popular outside patio and frequent visits from food trucks.

All their product is labeled with the tag line, "Proudly Brewed in Licking County, Ohio." The Homestead brewery is the largest brewery in Licking County. They were at the early wave of a craft beer tsunami. You can find their kegs on tap all over Ohio, including Progressive Field in Cleveland, and their bottles on grocery shelves and in pubs all over the region.
