Three-Minute Speech: Jeffery Wilson



Sergeant-At-Arms: Pat Jeffries fined **Jeffery Wilson**, came in at 2:27 on his 3-minute talk and wasted 33 seconds. Program: Marcia Downes introduced us to Mike Murasky who is the site leader of Boeing in Heath.

Mike began with his background, including his high school years as a Maysville Panther and graduate of Ohio University. He has been on site for 33 years with what is now Boeing. He has been married for 30 years and has 2 children.

Mike then went through the history of the Newark Air Base beginning in 1954 when Kaiser invented a new technology for wings on planes. Unfortunately though, the site was then abandoned by 1962, which brought on the Newark Air Base. In 1993, they lost a bid to bring a major company to the site. In 1996, John Glenn led a charge, along with other area leaders, to bring in Boeing.

The most important thing Boeing does is support the Nuclear Triad – Intercontinental Ballistic Missiles, Strategic Bombers, and Submarines Launched Ballistic Missiles. They are not here for offense, rather for defense and deterrents to protect more than 325 million Americans. They have not had an unsuccessful practice launch since 1990. They do these test launches to show the world it is working and is ready, if needed.

Aside from protection, Boeing also produces things like the Dreamliner -- the jet of the next generation which prevents jet lag by how it recycles the oxygen in the cabin. Mike suggested that, "you'll never want to fly another plane." The Dreamliner is mostly in Europe now, but is making its way over to the US.

Mike reminded us that Boeing is so much more than just an aircraft company. Both GPS on your cell phone and DirectTV are available because of Boeing satellites.

Mike and his team are trying to turn Boeing more into a manufacturing site, instead of a repair site. They are expecting 10-20% growth over the next 5 years. They have been fairly flat around \$100 million per year in revenues, and maxed out around 450 employees at the Heath plant over last 10-15 years.

They have not traditionally been involved in the community, but they are now focusing on community involvement and encouraging employees to get out and volunteer.
