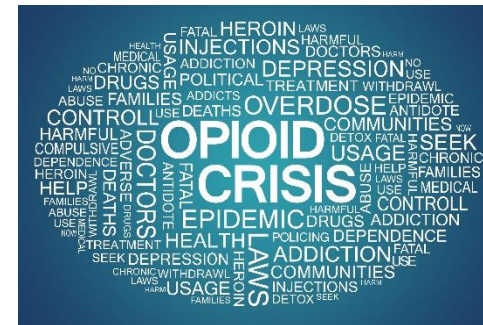

**Program: Pattye Whisman** introduced Denise Natoli Brooks who is the District Program Administrator of the Licking County Soil & Water Conservation District.

Denise began with a little background on herself. She grew up inside the New York City skyline, but has always loved the outdoors and knew she didn't want to live in the city when she grew up. She found her way to the Soil & Water field through a lot of mentorship and her love for nature. As an 18 year old girl that thought she could save the world by saving nature, she quickly learned that it happens little bits at a time through many small steps. For example, every year they support a "River Round-up," and they pull literally tons of junk out of the river each year. They could get upset and depressed about the seemingly endless amounts of trash, but they know with each piece of junk they pull out they are making a difference in the future. If they don't monitor the water, they don't know what's in it and can't help keep people healthy. Water is the lifeline of our lives.

Denise once had the opportunity to study abroad in Thailand where she learned about Buddhism and Conservation directly from Phra Paison, a Buddhist Monk. She found a ritual that they practice very interesting where they wrap orange sashes around big trees. They do this to honor their loved ones who have passed and believe they live on through the trees.

The Soil & Water Conservation District doesn't practice that same ritual, but they do understand the importance that trees have to our lives and to nature. They have been bringing in an average of 40,000 seedling trees per year for decades into the community and then help to plant them.

Through all of her experience, Denise has also learned about "Servant Leadership," where we lead through the service we provide to others. Denise feels strongly that the Soil & Water District helps to lead the community through their knowledge of nature, but mainly through the service they provide to the community and the knowledge they share to help the community preserve our natural resources.
