Last week's meeting

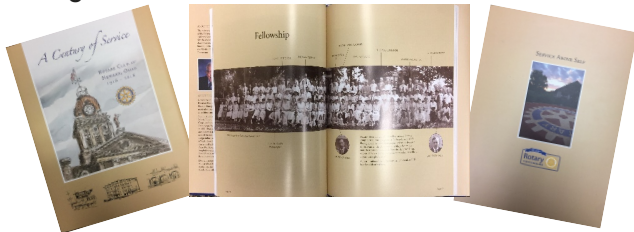

Program: **Jerry Besanceney** introduced Commissioner Tim Bubb.

Tim went into the county's experience with ransom ware. He stated that the armed services fought for our country and proved that our country was invulnerable. We may not lose a military war, but it's possible to lose a cyber war. Tim described two undeclared wars against America - drugs and cyber. He estimated that there are 6,000 people in North Korea working to hack our systems, and there is no defense. It's a war we could lose "sitting here fat and happy and not thinking about it."

So, what happened in Licking County? Offshore ransom ware Samsam infiltrated county computers. The ransom ware was injected looking for openings in the firewall or opportunities to visit computers. He described the ransom ware as a building with a thousand doors and 990 of those are locked but the others have cracks. It only takes one mistake or one open door for an attack to happen.

There were 100 servers operating after hours, and the 911 Center noticed it first when error messages started popping up on their screens. The bug got into one server and started replicating itself between the other servers and encrypting the files. The system had to be crashed in order to limit the damage. The phone system was even turned off. This made the county realize they need to have a plan between each department and organization in case this happened again.

There was an announcement made that the computers and phones were not going to be up and running that Wednesday morning. They spent the better part of the week trying to determine what it was. A message was received saying to pay up to 20 bit coins (\$28,000-\$30,000 American dollars) and the attackers would give a key. Tim said sometimes keys are not completely useful and the county chose not to do that.

For a week and a half, the county operated manually. Hard drives were sent to the FBI as forensic evidence. They were told that off shore hackers are beyond the reach of US law enforcement. It cost the county around \$56,000 to put everything back together. Even though it cost so much, there were no regrets with how it was handled. The county learned they could be better about testing systems from the outside and learning how to build a better firewall to further secure people's data.
