Program: **Patty Whisman** introduced Tiera Thurston, Tesla South Central District General Manager. Tiera has the opportunity to speak directly with Tesla Founder, Elon Musk, weekly. She now lives in Columbus and covers most of the area.

TESLA MISSION: Accelerate the worlds transition to Sustainable Energy.

Tesla was founded in 2003, and produced the first Roadster in 2008, which they partnered with Lotus to create. They opened their first retail store in 2009 in California. The IPO for their company stock launched in June 2010.

Currently they have over 400k reservations for the Model X, which is the largest launch of any product in the world. Model X recognizes when you approach the car and will open the door for you. It has been awarded the "Golden Steering Wheel Winner" and no other SUV has won a 5-Star rating. It weighs in at 5,500 pounds and it is nearly impossible to tip over due to weight differential.

The Model S has been deemed the "World's Quickest Car." Pushing the gas pedal can easily put you back in your seat and it can take off with the force of 1G.

All models come equipped with Autopilot – "Driver's Assistance," Autopark, Autosteer, Side Collision Warning, Auto Lane Change, and a "Summon" feature where you can call for your car and it will come to you.

Tiera showed a video of the Fremont Factory which they acquired for an attractive price from competitors in 2008 when values were low. It has the capacity to produce over 500k vehicles per year and is based out of San Jose.

Supercharging a car takes 30 minutes to get 80% of the battery re-charged. They are building a large network of Superchargers and a new one is going up every 36 hours across the US. Life of the battery would be over 500k miles, or 10-12 years.

TESLA ENERGY – Aside from cars, Tesla is focusing on other areas to help the push toward sustainable energy. They acquired Solar City and now produce Powerwall 2 (stores energy from solar and can build on top of itself), Powerpack 2 (Now providing 35% of the power on the island of Kuauai), and Solar Roofs.
