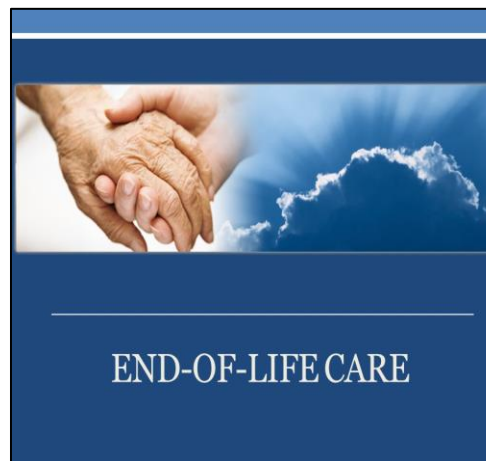

Sergeant-At-Arms: **Pat Jeffries** fined **Larry Palur** for singing during invocation and pointed out that his wedding singing career was a long time ago; **Sarah Wallace**, Downtown support; **John Carlson**, representing Minnesota on Facebook pictures; **Jerry Nethers**, closest to pin in Hopewell Cup; **Jon Spahr**, winner of Hopewell Cup; Anyone not wearing Pins & Badges.

Program: **Rick Platt** introduced our own **Peter Larson** to tell us the story of Klarity. Rick claimed that Peter is one of the "hidden heroes" that **Steve Layman** recently talked about. Because Peter is always entertaining us with music, some of us don't realize he also has a day job.

Peter began with a video clip from a movie talking about a future in plastics, and he joked how that is his reality. Klarity was started in his garage in Bexley and is now located here in Newark. They specialize in the manufacture and distribution of low temperature thermoplastics for medical devices. Sales are 50% in the USA and 50% foreign. His father Lester worked for DuPont where he focused on golf ball covers, or technically speaking, Transpolyisoprene (Synthetic Balata). After a stroke caused diminished ability in his wrist, he found that the material used for his golf balls could be used as splints for his hand and wrist. This device eventually made its way to Johnson & Johnson and is now distributed all over the world.

Peter expanded on this technology that his father discovered, and later himself discovered another product that competed directly with a company that had a monopoly on the market. Once he found a significant customer, he was able to quit his then day job at a TV network. In 1999, he got a new customer in Guangzhou, China who wanted to open up a factory over there. He decided to move forward with that and "Klarity" was born. He officially started this in 2001. At this point, they get raw materials from Texas & UK, which then moves to production in China. The final product is shipped to Klarity Headquarters in Newark where it is then shipped out to customers.

They went from 100% splinting materials used for Occupational Therapy in 2000 to about 10% in 2016, with 90% now in Radiation Therapy; Sales went from \$500k in 2000 to over \$3m in 2016; Staffing went from 2 to 16 in 2016. Their warehouse is located on Coffman Road in Newark, where they plan to remain. Heartland Bank helped them locate and buy this property.

They've been able to start producing products using a 3D printer. They have an office in Portland, OR, which is headed up by his daughter. This office mainly handles their online marketing and west coast sales.
