Program: **Pattye Whisman** introduced Dr. Eric Pacht, local MD at Licking Memorial Hospital.

Dr. Pacht began by announcing the main reason he was there: to help us understand the importance of Advanced Care Planning. What is Advanced Care Planning? It is an ongoing process that helps you think about what would be important to you if you were seriously ill. It helps you learn about your medical options and it can be done at any time, including when you are healthy.

When doing such planning, it's important to ask yourself questions such as: What kind of things are most important to me? What makes me happy? What fears do I have about getting sick or needing medical care? If I was very sick, are there any specific requests that I would have? How important is quantity versus quality of life? How important is it to live as long as possible, even if I will experience pain and suffering? How important is it to be at home when I die?

Another important step to Advanced Planning is to choose a trusted and reliable loved one to make decisions for you in the event you are incapacitated. Communicate with that person on a regular basis about your values, beliefs, wishes, and medical treatment goals as they may change over time.

Advance Directives are typically written documents designed to allow you the opportunity to guide future health care decisions in the event you are incapacitated and unable to participate in those decisions. As long as you retain your decision making capacity, you can revoke your decisions.

Dr. Pacht closed by sharing that 80% of people say they think it's important to have these conversations and make these plans. However, only 7% have reported actually having done it.
