Three-Minute Speech:

Program: Pattye Whisman introduced Mark Patton, native of the west coast who moved here to establish Jobs Ohio and is now VP of Columbus Partnership focusing on Smart City initiative.

Mark began with a story about transition. He described how we were driving around in buggies at the turn of the century. Columbus was the Buggy Manufacturing Capital of the US. He then showed a picture of a famous street in NYC lined with horse buggies, with only one vehicle present. He compared that to a picture of the same street 10 years later full of cars, and only 1 buggy. He emphasized how quickly things can, and have changed. With the Smart City initiative, they are focused on the acronym CASE:

- **Connected:** Connected vehicles will improve safety and efficiency of travel. Dynamic Ridesharing will improve connectedness between vehicles and handsets. This can help pedestrians also by alerting vehicles of the pedestrian crossing the street and vice versa.
- **Autonomous:** Smart Columbus talks to automakers often who all agree that Autonomous vehicles are coming, it's just not agreed upon when the switch would occur.
- **Shared:** Car sharing is similar to what AirBnB is for lodging. Uber & Lyft are very popular forms of Car/Ride sharing.
- **Electric:** Electric cars are increasing in popularity and are a very important part of Smart Columbus.

Winning the Smart City Initiative was a very big deal and Columbus was awarded this over many other major US cities. Mark claimed they won for 3 main reasons: "We had a really appealing application, we had proven partnerships between the city and the business community, and we came with \$90m from companies like OSU, AEP, LBrands, and Nationwide. As of June 2016, they had raised \$90m from these private funds, which has now grown to \$360m, with a goal of \$1b by 2020.
