Last Week's Meeting By Michele Layman

The Aug. 21 meeting of the Newark Rotary was called to order at 12:10 PM by President **Jeff Lawyer** and song leader, **Tom Slater**, led us in our R-O-T-A-R-Y song. Director, **Laura Lewis**, then led us in prayer and in the pledge of Allegiance. As school starts this week in most communities, **Tom Slater** led us in singing School Days but we didn't get a passing grade so we had to sing it twice!

Introduction of Guests: President Elect **Gary Baker** introduced and welcomed our guests of Rotarians. **Marcia Downes** introduced Susan Leithawser and **Joyce Malainy** introduced Ginny Evans. There were no visiting Rotarians.

Blue Ribbon Update: **Gary Baker** gave an update on the Rafiki project and expressed gratitude from Dr. Terry Davis. In 2008, the Newark Rotary bought two acres of

land in Rafiki and on August 14, they dedicated the Newark, Ohio, Rotary Club Technical School on that site. Gary showed the pictures and it was very impressive. Thanks to all who helped make that happen.

Gary then gave an update on the purchase of the bus for the Montana de Luz orphanage. The Rotary Club we were partnering with in Honduras to get the matching money from RI is a part of District 2450 and that district is part of an RI project called Future Visions. There are 100 districts worldwide in the project but 6690 is not. RI does not permit Future Vision participants to partner with non participants so the matching money is in jeopardy. The total needed is \$63,000 and to date \$26,500 has been raised with pledges to get it to \$36,500. District Governor, Calvin Gebhart is going to assist by helping to get District 6690 involved. Gary has started a **Move That Bus** campaign and the goal is to sell 30 seats at \$1000 per seat and the bus will be purchased. There will be a **Move That Bus** meeting at Gary's home on Aug. 31 at 7:00 and all are welcome. Together with District 6690 we will **Move That Bus!** Thanks to Gary for his dedication to this project.

Sergeant At Arms: Pat Jeffries was in a fundraising mood! Everyone was fined for either being involved with a school, having a child in school or having gone to school! We hope that was everyone. Individual fines went to **Gary Baker**, **Tom Mullady**, **Dave Hiles**, and **Tony Adams**. Some very special fines and announcements went to **Don Gunnerson** for his upcoming wedding on September 4, and to **Pamela Watkins** for her first grandchild, Kaley Jean and to **Jon Spahr** who has retired and joined **Bob Kent** in coming to Rotary in shorts!

Program:

President Jeff then introduced **Susan Fryer** to introduce the day's speaker. Eldon Hudson had a very successful career with AEP and retired after 42 ½ years. He has been a member of Rotary for 55 years and has 54 years perfect attendance! He is currently a member of the Zanesville Noon Club and is very active in the Zanesville community.

Eldon began by telling us that on July 1, 1955, he joined the Rotary Club in Dennison, Ohio, at the age of 29. On his way to his induction meeting his sponsor told him two very important expectations of him as a Rotarian. The first expectation was that you WILL attend meetings and the other was when someone in Rotary asks you to do something on behalf of Rotary you cannot say NO! These expectations have guided him throughout his years in Rotary.

A few months after his induction the Club President asked him to research the 4 Way Test and prepare a program on it for the Club. He agreed and found the information to be invaluable and he used it to guide the rest of his life. A recent article in the Rotarian, Is it the Truth, caused him to reflect on that presentation so he dug it out of his files, updated it and is now presenting it to area clubs and we were fortunate to

hear it. As we always say, some of our best presentations come from Rotarians.

The 4 Way Test is a 24-word document that is the heart of Rotary. It was penned by Herbert J. Taylor, a member of the Chicago club, in 1939. Taylor went on to be the Vice President Of Rotary International in 1941 and President in 1954 and 1955. Taylor had a strong belief in God and God's plan for us and it guided his actions every day.

1932, Taylor was assigned by Creditors of the Club Aluminum Company the task of trying to save the company. The company was a distributor of cookware and other household items and had a debt of over \$400,000. He was advised to file bankruptcy but just couldn't give up on the 250 employees, so he instead prayed on it and asked God for a guide to help them think, speak and do that which is right. He then immediately picked up a white card and began to write:

Is it the *truth*?

Is it *fair* to all concerned?

Will it build *goodwill* and *better friendship*?

Will it be *beneficial* to all concerned?

He then placed this card on his desk and for the next few days checked everything coming over his desk by it and was dismayed to see how many untruths appeared in the company's literature and how far they were from meeting these ideals. After 60 days of his constant effort to live up to these expectations he was convinced and began sharing these ideals with a few key employees and then all employees. He secured the copyright to these 24 words and the company adopted it as a statement. All employees were expected to memorize it and live by it. Within 20 years, the company had paid its debts in full and paid shareholders over \$1 million in dividends and had a value of over \$2 million.

In 1939, Taylor shared the 4 Way Test with the world. In 1941, Rotary International adopted it and in 1954, Taylor gifted the copyrights to RI. He died at the age of 85 after contributing much to the world and to RI.

Eldon charged us to realize that it is not displaying the test on a banner that is important but what is important is learning to live it. Eldon's experience taught him that if you use it 8 hours a day in your professional life, it will become impossible to not use it 24 hours a day, seven days a week. Eldon then reflected on how the 4 Way Test had gotten him through his career and through a very difficult time with another Rotarian. A difficult situation was overcome because they both believed in the principles of the test and tried to live them everyday.

President Jeff ended the meeting by having us all recite the 4 Way Test.

The raffle went unclaimed and the money went to **Move That Bus**.
