**3 About Me:** Past President **Jim Cooper** gave a short talk on his time as President, which was from 1960-1961. He joined Rotary in 1953 and it was an all-male club at that time. It wasn't until 1981 that women were accepted as members. He told a story about then congressman John Ashbrook and Chamber President Al Milliken and how the two of them were able to bring the Air Force to Licking County in 1961. He then thanked Rick Platt for doing a great job for the Port Authority.

**Sergeant-At-Arms: Pat Jeffries** was able to raise some money by fining the following people: **Rick Platt, Tom Henderson, John Row, Glenn Abel, Ed Bohren, Barb Quackenbush, Gary Baker** and **Jerry Nethers**.

Program: **Rick Platt** introduced Ohio Department of Transportation Director Jerry Wray.

Director Wray spent the first few minutes recognizing ODOT District 5 Deputy Director Sonja Simpson. He told everyone how she was able to keep salt on the roads throughout Ohio during the tough winters a few years ago.

He also told a funny story about when he was ODOT Director under Governor Voinovich and was given a "Promises List," which included 141 projects that the governor had made promises about during his campaign year.

Director Wray explained how the department is funded: It is funded with the federal and state gas tax for the most part. Out of its \$3 billion budget, 43% comes from the federal government, 43% from state government, 9% from bonds and 5% from fees. Since 2011, the department has saved over \$600 million in operations that was moved to fund construction projects.

In 1991 there were just under 8,000 employees in the department. Today, they have close to 5,000. Over 90% of what they do relates to maintaining what infrastructure they already have in place.

Thanks to the financial leverage of the Ohio Turnpike, many projects have been completed or started that would have had to wait for many years. He ended his talk by saying "ODOT does not suck" (referring to the sign on Ohio 161).
