Program: **Eriech Horvath** introduced Wayne Campbell. Wayne is the founder of Tyler's Light, an organization that seeks to equip our communities and our nation with information and resources to help people choose a drug-free life, while providing resources for family members and friends who are involved in the battle against addiction. Tyler's Light was formed after Wayne's son, Tyler, died from a drug overdose several years ago. **Jerry Besanceney** presented Wayne with our club's 2016 Service Above Self Award.

Wayne first shared his message with our club last year. He stated that meeting propelled something and inspired Park National Bank,

The Energy Cooperative and Licking Memorial Health Systems to become sponsors to allow Tyler's Light to make presentations to Licking County schools to raise awareness of prescription drug abuse. Licking County was the first local county to provide that type of support the Tyler's Light. Since that time, Wayne has visited 75% of Licking County High schools and 25% of Licking County middle schools.

Tyler's Light receives positive feedback from students, teachers and other individuals who attend presentations. One such example was when Wayne heard from a local law enforcement officer whose 16-year-old son had been prescribed pain medication after an injury. The son, who had heard a Tyler's Light presentation at Utica High School, asked if the medication was an opiate. Knowing the dangers of opiates, when the doctor responded yes, the young man asked for a different medication.

Besides going into schools, Tyler's Light has started a step 2 program via "Drug-Free Clubs." Drug Free Clubs are formed at schools and are comprised of students who elect to be drug-free. After paying a small fee to join, students take drug screens throughout the year. As long as the students remain drug-free, they are eligible for various rewards from their school and local businesses. In the event that a member tests positive from a drug, their membership is suspended, with the chance to return to the club by taking a clean drug test. The Drug-Free Clubs were started in Pickerington two years ago and now have over 700 members.

Wayne offered free presentations to all Ross County schools, due to the particularly high-risk heroin addiction rates within the county. All eight schools that were presented to have formed Drug-Free Clubs. Two weeks ago, all eight schools held a rally together and marched through Chillicothe to raise awareness.

Wayne shared a few educational videos that he integrates into his presentation (Videos available at www.tylerslight.com). Wayne continues to present throughout central Ohio, promoting drug prevention, awareness and support to reduce the loss of life due to drug addiction.
