Three-minute talk: James R. Cooper, III, shared that his grandfather was Newark Rotary President in 1928 and his father, Jim Cooper, was Rotary President in 1960, and that he will be next in 2047. Jim and his wife, Ellen, principal at Legend Elementary in Newark City Schools, have three kids and 5 grandchildren. Jim is a Retired Naval officer (1996) and is currently an attorney in downtown Newark. Jim is also a distance runner and ran in the 2013 Boston Marathon and shared his thoughts about the book, "There Shall Be No Night." He felt the ideals of hope, nobility of purpose will prevail. Jim shared this was a "Master stroke for me" as he trained hard for the 2014 Boston Marathon.

Sergeant-At-Arms: Pat Jeffries fined **Jim Cooper III** for his 4:20 talk. Speaker: Cheri Hottinger introduced **Yaromir Steiner**. Yaromir was born in Turkey, has a slight accent, speaks four languages, is a father of 4 and developed Easton Town Center. He also was in the French 11th Airborne Division. Yaromir helped to develop a community vision for Buckeye Lake and the city of Newark. Yaromir shared the history of the BLR (Buckeye Lake Region) 2030 (formerly 2036) Initiative beginning with the initial meeting on Dec. 1, 2015, which included 40 civic leaders at the Buckeye Lake Yacht Club at the request of the Urban Land Institute Columbus District Council. The goal of this meeting was to consider the possibility of a visioning session for the future of Buckeye Lake. Many stakeholders were involved as 270 community members, residents, business owners and civic and political leaders gathered at Lakewood High School Jan. 23, 2016. At this meeting, the group worked on identifying a common vision as well as the core values shared by the community. Four months after the January meeting, draft documents were shared and circulated for comments by all of the participants. The final draft was presented and approved on May 14. Task forces were identified along with determining to conduct three community meetings each year.

Yaromir shared many of the details involving ODNR, OSU, technology, branding and creating a new logo and focusing on the lake, land and leisure. Yaromir also shared the focus on hospitality, agriculture, tourism and the arts along with the establishment of breweries and distilleries.

Yaromir introduced Aaron Domini from OHM Architects and Planning, who shared he uses our Newark community as an example of how to get things done. Aaron shared the beginning of a vision plan for Newark "What's next?" Not a clear roadmap yet. We should be doing something as a community with our vision. Aaron shared the creation of the Newark Vision Plan 2028 led by Yaromir, himself and the Newark Development Partners.
