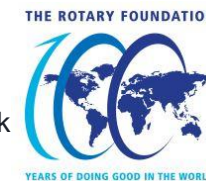


THIS WEEK'S MEETING

Last week's meeting

Jack welcomed back **John Carlson** (injury) and **T.D. Griley** (new hip). **Dave Shull** led us with the invocation and Pledge of Allegiance. Tom and Peter led us in singing "When Johnny Comes Marching Home."

President Elect Chuck Moore introduced our guests: Jon Renner (**Rod Yost**); Kate Saylor (**Molly Ingold**); Beth Pratt (**Rob Klinger**).

Announcements:

- Chuck told us our January service project will benefit New Beginnings. He has since emailed a list of items needed, including cleaning and personal items, plus diapers and underwear for young children. Bring items to meetings.
- **Nick Adams** received his regular blue badge after completing the new member checklist.

Sergeant-At-Arms: Pat Jeffries fined **Nick Adams** (new badge); **Peter Larson** (no fine for holiday music recently); **John Carlson** (long stay in Minnesota); anyone whose team lost; **Steve Layman** (article on converting school); **Jim Withers** (1-year anniversary); **Sarah Wallace** (LMHA Lifetime Achievement Award); and all Browns fans for team's win. Pat then auctioned off some tickets for the best team in the NHL donated by The Advocate and **Jeff Gold**.

Program: Bob McGaughy introduced Doug Stout from the Licking County Library who is leading the Veterans Project to document the history of veterans from Licking County. His specific program focused mainly on World War II, including seven of our living members who served during the war.

The library has built an online database called "In the Company of Heroes" where information on every local veteran is being added. He'll be adding video soon.

While we don't know how many Licking Countians have served our country, we do know there have been 194 deaths. There were 23 locals at Pearl Harbor and 2 deaths (Murle Davis and Melvin Hurn from the USS Arizona).

Doug recounted the stories of several local veterans who took part in the Bataan Death March, where the Japanese marched prisoners a

long distance. Five locals died then or later from disease.

Doug shared how many veterans don't think they have stories to share, but once they begin speaking, it's clear they do have stories. One WWII vet, James Vogel, told Doug about how he built dummy barges to confuse the Germans about D-Day. He later crossed into Germany to help build oil pipelines to keep up with the advancing troops.

Two local soldiers did participate in D-Day. Both Bernard Spring and Gene Kinney were killed in action.

As for our WWII club members, they include:

- **Orville Varasso**, Army Military Intelligence (1942-45)

Doug stressed these are just a few of the many veterans from Licking County who have served our country. For a county of our size, we have served our country well. He wants to make sure our veterans are not forgotten. He's grateful the library is supporting the project and is now working to add as many photos and artifacts as possible.

Members then honored our WWII vets with a standing ovation.

President Jack also asked all veterans to stand.
