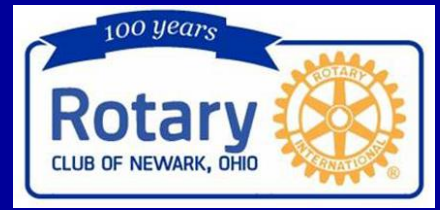

History moment: Donn Alspach reviewed his year as President in 1977-78. Jack Davis from Bermuda was International President. Ray Mason of Columbus was Governor. There were 152 clubs and 860,000 members, worldwide. Our club had 170 members (There

had been 87 members when Donn first joined in 1957).

Sergeant-At-Arms: **Pat Jeffries** fined **Steph McManus** (standing in voting line); **Molly Ingold** and **Pattye Whisman** and others (wearing political garb); and all members seated at Pattye Whisman's table (special lunch table).

Program: **T.D. Griley** introduced Ken Schuppert Jr. Ken serves as the vice chairman of The Rotary Foundation. Ken acknowledged the special centennial year for both, our club and The Rotary Foundation. The first gift to The Foundation was \$26.50 from The Rotary Club of Kansas City, Mo. The Foundation now has over \$1 billion in assets.

Gifts to The Rotary Foundation are helping to make the entire world a better place and allow Rotarians to move beyond making an impact in only their own backyard. Resources from The Foundation provide access to money, knowledge and expertise to address major world issues. Recent examples include using Polio operation centers in Nigeria to quickly address the Ebola Outbreak, teaching Syrian refugees in Germany marketable skills to increase their employability, and conducting a Water Symposium in central Asia to work toward preventing a clean water crisis in the area.

Ken shared that when making a gift to The Rotary Foundation you know where your money is going – it's returned to you via Global and District Grants. Trustees and Foundation staff review major grants, and a group of volunteer Rotarians help applicants through the technical process. Many volunteers help The Foundation keep administrative costs low. Charity Watchdog, and independent charity watchdog, has awarded The Rotary Foundation with a 100% rating for financial health, accountability and transparency. Less than 1% of nonprofits receive this perfect score.

A fundraising goal of \$300 million has been set for the centennial year. Ken encouraged all to give to The Rotary Foundation to help empower Rotary members to continue fighting disease, reducing poverty, providing clean water, promoting peace, and advancing economic development in communities all over the world.
