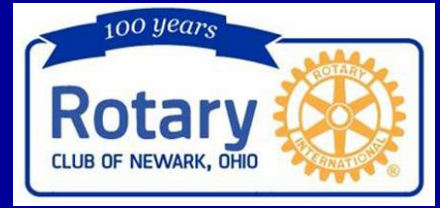

Sergeant-At-Arms: Pat Jeffries fined a number of fine Rotarians for their recognition in the community. He auctioned off a couple of OSU basketball tickets to raise money for the club.

Program: Gene Smith, Ohio State University's athletic director, was introduced by Rotarian **Donn Alspach**. Gene started out by saying how great of year the athletic program had last year graduating 203 student athletes and 561 being recognized as student athletes. The school came in 2nd across the nation in the Director's Cup award. We have a strong ladies volleyball team this year and the men's

basketball program should be better this year. Gene is hoping for dry weather at the Michigan vs. Ohio State football game as we are doing very well in our passing game. We can throw the football!

Gene stopped his speech to open the floor to questions we might have about Ohio State athletics.

He was given a good question and concern by Rotarian **Ralph Cohagan** about whether OSU would sell out to big corporations and rename the stadium, the band or the field. Gene assured us this would not happen, saying how it is impossible to put a value on tradition.

We won't see OSU football on Friday night. We are the big game with a big audience happening on Saturdays and only on Thursday if it is the season opener. The smaller weaker schools that play will use the Friday game as recruiting tool to improve their program. OSU is all about the league and needs to help them out.

Gene does not see a playoff expansion from four teams to eight, stating they can't go further into January because of the NFL. It's also hard on the athletes to compete and stay healthy with more games.

He does see a change in the leagues, merging to form maybe four super conferences. He pointed out that the college football playoff is not governed by the NCAA, but they do however govern the basketball tournament in March and do an excellent job with it.

Gene is not a big proponent of 'pay to play' but does everything in his power legally to see the student athletes are comfortable. He mandates all student athletes have a bank account and teaches them financial literacy. He brings back older players to talk to the students about making wise choices.

St. John Arena will be saved and renovated for academic purposes. His athletic department is responsible for more than 18 million gross square feet of buildings.

Gene concluded by thanking us all for supporting OSU athletics.
