Announcements:

- Rotary Park Update: **Eriech Horvath** and **Jeff James** spoke about the fund-raising campaign. Eriech said they set two goals; 1) get 100% participation from Newark Rotarians, they reached 91% when an anonymous donor stepped in and donated money for the non-contributors. 2) Raise \$500,000, which they met and exceeded. **Gary Baker** reported things moved very quickly with the renovations and additions thanks to Robertson Construction. A new playground service has been put down, the new pavilion is nearly completed, and the concrete walk and slabs for the picnic pods are complete. Some landscaping and clean-up will occur during the winter to be completed and ready to go by spring.

Program: Rotarian **Bob McGaughy** introduced Newark Rotarian

Jerry Besanceney, a retired US Army Colonel and successful business man both locally and internationally. Jerry spoke about American veterans from the Revolutionary War to the present. He recognized Doug Stout, of the Licking County Library, who has compiled a complete list of all Licking Countians who served in the US military and gave their lives. This information can be found on the library's web site.

American veterans are people who serve the pioneers of the greatest democracy on earth. This country gives so much to the world and takes in more people than any other country he has been in. He pointed out that it's not about the veteran but their families and friends who are affected by the service. Our military is an Athens style military not a Sparta, we defend and are not the aggressor.

Jerry gave a slide presentation showing tombstones of Revolutionary War veterans from this area: Jamie Craig and a Major Anthony Pitzer. He pointed out that even though Ohio was not a state, there were some 40 to 50 veterans from this area who served in that war. There were a number of veterans of the War of 1812 from Canada that settled in Ohio as they were promised free land for their service.

Jerry pointed out that Licking County lost approximately 500 veterans during the Civil War. Considering that our population was only about 11,000, it makes that number pretty significant.

Shawnee Indians may have given Ohio its Buckeye name as they tried insulting a US Colonel Sprague, calling him 'haytook' which is Shawnee for buckeye. Well Sprague shouted back: 'I'm proud to be a 'haytook.' Then we are all 'haytooks!'"

Jerry became emotional talking about US veterans, even pausing for a moment. He concluded by stating that according to the US Service Commission there are approximately 15,000 veterans in Licking County at this time. American veterans over the years have served for all the right reasons. They take care of each other and they take care of us.

Thought of the Week: In the presidential election of 1916 – President Woodrow Wilson won re-election. Ohio voters supported Wilson's campaign. The election was so close that if Ohio had chosen Charles Evans Hughes, the Electoral College votes would have turned the election in Hughes favor. *From Ohio History Central.*
