## Last week's meeting

**Introduction of Guests: President-Elect Chuck Moore** introduced District Governor nominee Craig Maxey and member's guests were also recognized: Christopher Thorne (**Mike Thorne**), Christy Strum (**Nate Strum**), Emily Davidson (**Rick Platt**), and Jim Cooper (**Jim Cooper**). **Stacy Thompson** introduced the Newark Rotary Club-sponsored Wilson Middle School Interact Club members and their principal, Mr. John Davis. President Jack presented Interact Club officers with a signed Rotary Certificate indicating their official chartering as a Club. Interact Club President Hayley Cochran remarked about the Club's achievements from last school year and plans ahead for this one.

**Sergeant-at-Arms: Pat Jeffries** fined all October birthdays, **Mike Higgins**, **Tom Henderson** (for birth of a granddaughter), **Rick Platt**, **Stephanie McManus**, **Barb Quackenbush**, representatives of member's companies who were ranked tops in "Best of Licking County" list, **Nick Adams**, **Nate Strum**, **Megan Evans**, **Jack Stickle**, **Tony Adams**, **Fred Ernest**, and **Jim Matesich**. The latter grouping was either those persons recognized for "20 Under 40" or parents of those so recognized.

**Program:** Rick Platt introduced Tom Stickrath, Superintendent of Ohio's Bureau of Criminal Investigation. Stickrath has the distinction of serving under six governors and an attorney general during his 30-year criminal justice career. His remarks were part of a PowerPoint presentation and a rapid-fire review of a wide range of the work of BCI. In 2015, BCI had 917 lab cases and eight investigations among its Licking County work.

The agency was founded 95 years ago and was housed in the basement of the old Ohio Penitentiary in Columbus until conditions caused the relocation to London, Ohio where it remains headquartered today. BCI became part of

the Attorney General's office in 1963 and has field offices in Richfield, Bowling Green, Youngstown, Cambridge, and Athens. He reviewed the divisions and specialized units of BCI, noting its role in a large number of recognizable cases in recent years, including the Ariel Castro case in Cleveland and the Pike County murders earlier in 2016. On the latter, he said, "We will solve that."

The superintendent noted an initiative of Ohio Attorney General DeWine aimed at addressing turnaround times in evidence processing. The baseline was 125 days in 2010 and, after KAIZEN systems and other initiatives, the baseline turnaround time is down to 23 days. That turnaround metric, it was noted, was accomplished even with a ten-fold increase in DNA workload. He cited a 26-hour turnaround in a kidnapping/rape case that resulted in a conviction.

Stickrath concluded with deeper looks at the new Crimes Against Children Unit, the new Center for the Future of Forensic Science, a partnership with Battelle for next generation DNA technology, and STEM education program that will be rolled out to fourth graders statewide in 2017. Questions from the floor brought out more about the state and national scene and the policy changes in DNA sampling.
