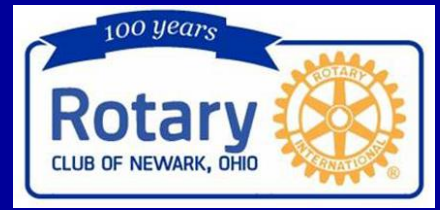

History moment: Steve Ehret recapped 1986 when the club celebrated its 70th Anniversary. The president that year was Bill Moore. Past presidents of the club were recognized. They discussed initial success of the Polio Plus program.

Sergeant-At-Arms: Pat Jeffries fined All Rotarians born in August (birthday); Everyone in Rotary 30 years ago (part of history moment); **Bob McGaughy, John Carson, Glenn Abel, Jim Cooper, T.D. Griley, Rod Yost, Gary Baker, Bob Barnes** (for their names being mentioned in the 1986 Rotogram circulated as part of the history moment, noted that he will fine Jack Neely when he returns for being a new member in that Rotogram); Any Rotarian without a pin or badge; Bowling Green grads; Anyone who went to the OSU football game and stayed to the end; **Sharad Thakkar** for coming in second at

a golf outing; **Charles Noble, Crawford Lipsey, and Tom Brannon** for wearing Hawaiian shirts; **Larry Palur** in recognition of his son's military service.

Program: Tom Marcelain introduced Mike Buenger, Administrative Director for the Ohio Supreme Court. He spoke of his time spent in the former Yugoslavia area as part of the Kosovo Justice Support Project. Conflicts broke out in 1989 across the region with only Macedonia peacefully separating from the former Yugoslavia.

Kosovo is the poorest country in Europe, with 2.5 million residents and a per capita income just under \$3,000 per year. 88% of people are Albanian, 10% Serbian, and 2% other groups. Islam is the major religion followed by Serbian Orthodox. In March of 2008, Kosovo unilaterally declared independence from Serbia. Main causes of conflict: were ethnic divides, economic inequality and a tilted justice system, among others.

Kosovo has little public transparency of judicial process. The lack of courtrooms forces judges to hear cases in their offices. This, in addition to low wages, leads to corruption. Bribes are common.

Lessons learned through his time in Kosovo: law is the product of culture; changing law post conflict is a generational process; courts need public support; the United States is unique for civics organizations we maintain (organizations like Rotary are critical to progress and stability); the worst thing a society can do is restrict access to fair and impartial justice; in post conflict environments, it is important to get to the truth.
