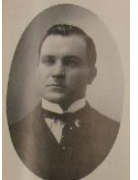
THIS WEEK'S MEETING

Program: Dan DeLawder introduced fellow Rotarian **Tom Atha**. Tom is a graduate of Denison and held his 1st position with Owens Corning, then an acoustics job at Nationwide Arena. In 2006, he started his own business in Downtown Newark called Earthworks Studio. Tom also works part-time for a music class at Denison. He is currently working Thirty One West.

Tom began by thanking **Bob McGaughy**, Dan DeLawder and Park National Bank for their support. He then showed a video to bring us up to speed on the progress so far at Thirty One West. The video showed the painstaking process to preserve the history of the original building located at 31 W. Church St. Some tiles taken from the ceiling had 30-40 nails that needed pulled out carefully so to not destroy the original. They removed 30 tons of trash and spent close to 8 months demolishing the interior. Tom has a clear passion for preserving a historical building, but to also connect us back to our roots and create a good downtown feel.

Earthworks Studio is coming up on a 10-year anniversary and has seen much success. One example of that success is that Earthworks traces roots of a very popular band called 21 Pilots. The current drummer of 21 Pilots was an intern at Earthworks and Tom, himself, used to play bass for the group. Not since the Beatles has a band had a #1 and #2 top song at the same time—21 Pilots has recently achieved that. Tom feels Thirty One West could be a place for such up and coming artists to grow and showcase their talents.

Tom went on to thank **Steve Layman** for introducing him to this building and joked that it's taken up 4 years of his life, due to the extensive makeover. He then showed us a slideshow of pictures that illustrated the progress of the building and the different venues inside. Thirty One West will feature 5 commercial tenants, including Thirty One, which will be the musical venue; Denison will have art gallery and Bluegrass studio; Moe's BBQ; Sage Yoga studio; and Little Arrows Child Play Café. It will also feature 14 residential apartments with an average of 800 square feet, and a workout space for those tenants.

They are already getting calls from talent agencies with interest due to the lack of this type of venue in central Ohio.
